


2022: On the road & onto new adventures


VISION

FROM THE BOARD

2022 was an important year in Bike & Build's history - a year of new beginnings, heartfelt goodbyes, and getting back to 'normal.' We ran our first summer trips since before the pandemic. We embraced WFH and went fully remote. welcomed both a new Program Director (Cori) and Ops & Development Director (Jo). Erik Wright and Casey Eisenreich, who have embodied the vision of what B&B can and should be, moved on to their next chapters after years of service. We owe a similar debt of gratitude to longtime Board Chair, Skip Burns, who stepped down after seeing B&B through some of its most challenging years.

We are all extremely proud of the work put in this year and are even more excited for what's on the horizon - 2023 is Bike & Build's 20th anniversary and a testament to the wide ranging impact it continues to have. Thank you to our alumni, our Board, our riders, our build partners, and above all our staff for leading the way.





5 Routes

This year, Bike & Build ran 3 cross-country and 2 regional routes. Most of the 2022 routes will be familiar to the Bike & Build community including, Southern U.S., Northern U.S., Central U.S., and Drift West. The final route was a one-week trek from Pittsburgh to D.C. called Pitt Drift.

111 Riders

After two years without Bike & Build's foundational programming, the community has grown with stellar new alumni!

12,973 miles biked

From riding through mountain passes in Montana to traversing deserts in Arizona, riders uncovered the small town treasures and urban vibrancy of the United States.

57 days volunteered

Bike & Build rides to partner and support affordable housing organizations throughout the country. This summer, riders built foundations, learned from housing experts, and gained a deeper understanding of the housing crisis today.

BREAKING DOWN BARRIERS



Awarded More Funding Than Ever Before

Due to the Rowan Family Foundation's generous funding, Bike & Build lowered financial barriers to our service-oriented bike trips for more riders than ever. Bike & Build was able to award 17 riders with funding for 2022 bike trips - 8 of which were awarded Inclusivity Grants.



Uplifting Under-Served Groups

The Inclusivity Grant aims to elevate the stories and voices of those most impacted by housing inequalities and most under-represented within cycling. The grant includes full funding, plus travel and gear, for riders who self identify as people of color, transgender and non-binary individuals, members of the LGBTQIA+ community, individuals with long-lasting or chronic illnesses, and others who feel they are under-represented.

Frame Our Future

Frame Our Future lays the foundation for B&B. In 2022, Alumni donated over \$39,000 in recurring donations and helped B&B build inclusive and impactful programming.



Board Members

The Board of Directors supports Bike & Build through mission-based leadership and strategic governance. The alumni community represents 73% of board members.



Trip Leaders

Every year, recent and seasoned alumni return to Bike & Build with the desire to dive deeper into the experience as Trip Leaders. In 2022, **56**% of 2022 Trip Leaders were Alumni.



2022 PROGRAMS

2022 found Bike & Build back on the road for 3 cross-country trips and 2 regional trips: the Southern U.S., Central U.S., and Northern U.S. cross country routes, along with Drift West in the Pacific Northwest, and Pitt Drift in the northeast. After a two year hiatus, it was energizing to be back on the road riding and building! 111 riders spent a total of 57 days volunteering with partners new and old across the country. Along with our iconic cross country rides, Bike & Build partnered with Metropolitan State University of Denver to plan and execute a community ride around Denver, Colorado, meeting with a variety of organizations addressing affordable housing.

BUILD PARTNER SPOTLIGHT

Low Income Housing Institute (LIHI)

LIHI in Washington State "develops, owns and operates housing for the benefit of low-income, homeless and formerly homeless people in Washington State and administers a range of supportive service programs to assist those they serve in maintaining stable housing and increasing their self-sufficiency." In 2022, the 27 riders on Drift West volunteered with LIHI's Tiny House Village in Seattle. According to LIHI, "tiny houses offer a grassroots solution to the Puget Sound region's homelessness crisis. A tiny house is approximately 8' x 12' and materials cost about \$4,000. All tiny houses are safe, sturdy structures that help protect homeless individuals and families who are faced with sleeping on the streets in unsafe conditions. Each house has electricity, overhead light, insulation, and a heater. Each village has a kitchen, bathroom and laundry facilities, offices for on-site case managers, ample storage, and a check-in house for security." Bike & Builders volunteered their labor for a day of work, including painting tiny homes, building shelving in the homes, sorting donations, and clearing brush. Bike & Builders said it was a "really cool program, and definitely one of my favorite build days. Easily one of the most direct projects in terms of finding solutions to the affordable housing crisis that the Pacific Northwest is facing."





Program Outcomes

At the end of each trip, riders are asked to complete a survey so Bike & Build can understand the impact of the programming and ensure the mission is fulfilled. 67 out of 111 riders responded from 2022 routes:



Understand how their social identities connect to oppression, power, and privilege

Feel that they can competently discuss affordable housing issues with their peers





Plan to volunteer with local affordable housing organization at least once a month

Aim to pursue a career or hobbies that will help other people



Over the years, rider recruitment for our summer programming has been dwindling. Our past and current staff & board members have chased down every idea, lead, and partnership to keep our organization, and therefore our mission, afloat. The COVID-19 pandemic made this challenge more difficult as we canceled trips two years in a row and lost the #1 source of recruitment - recent alumni. The combination of rising costs (gear, vehicles, fuel, etc.) and reduced rider enrollment has put Bike & Build in survival mode for too long. Our mission may be more relevant than ever, but our model is no longer sustainable.

Thus, it is with heavy hearts that we're announcing the plan to sunset Bike & Build after 2023 summer programming - our 20th year pedaling for affordable housing.
